- 3. GENERAL STATEMENT OF REASONABLE NECESSITY: The Board of Private Alternative Adolescent Residential or Outdoor Programs (board) has determined it is reasonably necessary to amend fees to comply with 37-1-134, MCA, and keep the board's fees commensurate with costs. The Department of Labor and Industry (department), in providing administrative services to the board, has determined that unless the licensure fees are increased as proposed, the board will have a shortage of operating funds by the 2009 renewal period.

The 2005 Montana Legislature created the board to register programs and gather data regarding the feasibility of program licensure. In FY 2005, 24 programs registered with the department and fees were collected to support the work of the board. The 2007 Legislature mandated full licensure of the programs. The ending cash balance in FY 2007 was \$4,865.

In FY 2008 the board set fees for registration, provisional licensing, and licensure renewal based on average daily census. Expenses for the board in FY 2008 totaled \$47,331, with revenue of \$23,626, which resulted in an ending cash balance of negative \$18,840. This required the board to obtain a loan to maintain operations until accruing additional revenue.

At the end of February 2009, total revenue received was \$56,240, total expenses were \$30,520, and the present cash balance was \$6,880.

Although the department and board anticipated that the number of licensed programs would increase during the 2008-2009 biennium, the number has decreased. Several programs have ceased operation over the past few months, including the largest and only program having 101 or more participants. The closures and resultant loss of revenue will critically impact the board and its ability to function. The board determined it is necessary to redistribute and increase fees as proposed to meet expenses and counter the anticipated decrease in annual revenue as a result of the program closures. The board is also adding a category to the fee structure to reallocate fees across five groups instead of four. The board estimates that approximately 17 programs will be affected by the proposed fee changes and will result in a cumulative increase in annual revenue of \$14,480.

- 5. The board has thoroughly considered the comments and testimony received. A summary of the comments received and the board's responses are as follows:

<u>COMMENT #1</u>: Marco Ferro, on behalf of MEA-MFT, stated that he supported the rules as written with the exception of ARM 10.57.414(b)(vii). He would like to keep the language in that section that reads, "three semester credits of college coursework in Montana school law and three semester credits of college coursework in Montana school finance" and delete the remainder of that subsection to be similar to the Class 5 language that applies to Class 1, 2, or 6 licensure.

RESPONSE #1: The board thanks Mr. Ferro for his input and agrees with his comment. The board has amended ARM 10.57.414(b)(vii) by deleting the last sentence of that subsection.

<u>COMMENT #2</u>: Dave Puyear, on behalf of MREA, stated that he supported the rules as written with the exception of ARM 10.57.414(b)(vii). He recommended that the board amend this section to be similar to the Class 5 language. He believes it would eliminate any confusion between what is expected for licensure of teachers and administrators and would promote a seamless system of licensure.

<u>RESPONSE #2</u>: The board thanks Mr. Puyear for his input and agrees with his testimony. The board has amended ARM 10.57.414(b)(vii) by deleting the last sentence of that subsection.

<u>COMMENT #3</u>: Bob Vogel, on behalf of the MTSBA, stated he supported the rules as written and believes they are clear and straight forward. He pointed out what he considered to be substantive differences between teachers and administrators to support a rule which is different between the two professions.

<u>RESPONSE #3</u>: The board thanks Mr. Vogel for his support but disagrees with his testimony regarding the differences between teachers and administrators underlying his argument to leave the rule as noticed.

<u>COMMENT #4</u>: Darrell Rud, on behalf of SAM, stated his support for the rules as written.

<u>RESPONSE #4</u>: The board thanks Mr. Rud for his support but disagrees that the rule should go forward as noticed.

<u>COMMENT #5</u>: Claudette Morton, on behalf of the MSSA, stated her support for the rules as written with the exception of:

She recommended the following language: "(b) the school(s) they are claiming to hold or have held supervisory responsibilities over have noted there is no superintendent or principal by having the chair of the Board of Trustees submit evidence of the supervisory role of the county superintendent."

<u>RESPONSE #5</u>: The board thanks Dr. Morton for her support. The board will take comment (a) under advice and has amended ARM 10.57.102(20)(b) as suggested.

<u>COMMENT #6</u>: Ann Gilkey, on behalf of the OPI, stated support for the rules and submitted written suggested nonsubstantive amendments to the rules for clarification, ease of reading, and consistency.

<u>RESPONSE #6</u>: The board thanks Ms. Gilkey for her support and has amended the rules as suggested.

- (c) the food service <u>must establish and maintain standards relative to food sources, refrigeration, refuse handling, pest control, storage, preparation, procuring, serving, and handling that are sufficient to prevent food spoilage and transmission of infectious disease shall comply with the Montana administrative rule requirements for compliance with ARM Title 37, chapter 110, subchapter 2, Food Service Establishments administered by the Food and Consumer Safety Section of the Department of Public Health and Human Services.</u>
 - (d) through (13) remain as proposed.

4. The department has thoroughly considered the comments and testimony received. A summary of the comments received and the department's responses are as follows:

<u>COMMENT #1</u>: In proposed amendment to ARM 37.106.2311(10)(c) it was stated that incorporating the food service establishment regulations would be overwhelming and burdensome for the small, residential facilities to implement. The proposed regulation change would have the potential to impede the delivery of residential hospice services, and/or the construction of any new facilities in the state.

<u>RESPONSE #1</u>: The department concurs and understands that the current regulations are sufficient in preventing the spread of infection or disease in residential hospice facilities. The department made its correction to proposed rule ARM 37.106.2311(10)(c) as shown above.

<u>COMMENT #2</u>: There was concern that the provisions referenced in the food services rules in Title 37, chapter 110, subchapter 2 are more stringent than necessary for residential hospice facilities.
